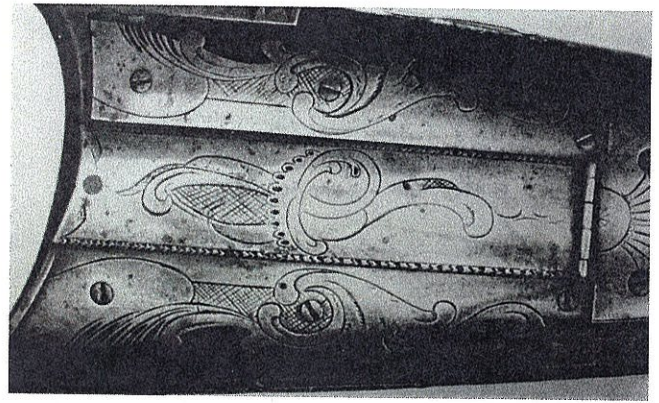
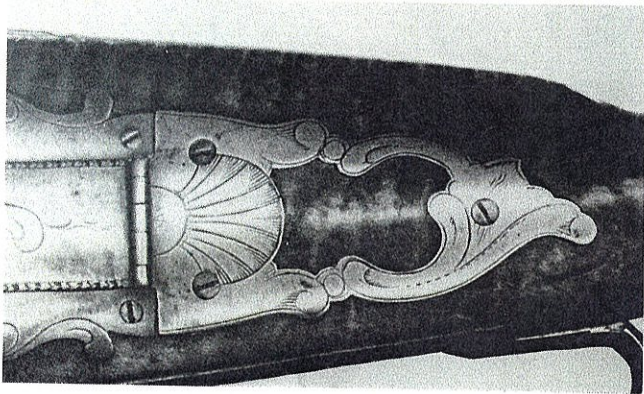


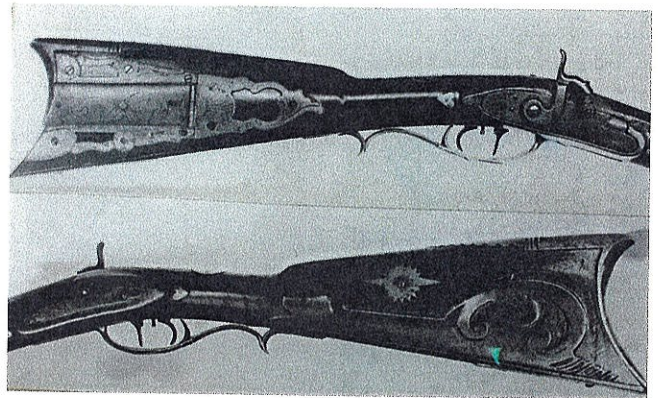
*The four piece patch box of Rifle 1 is made of two parallel side plates, a finial, and a lid (Rifle 1).

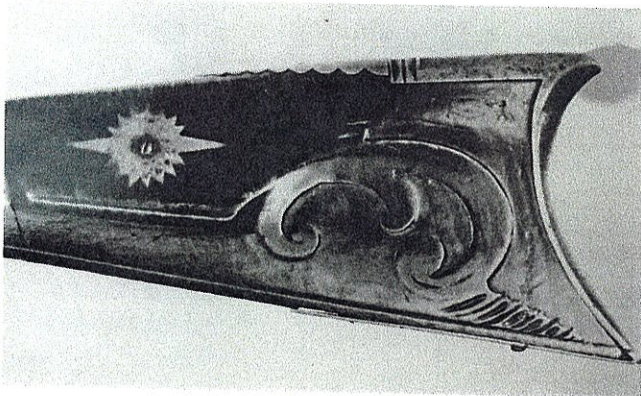
*Close-up of patch box engraving on Rifle 1.

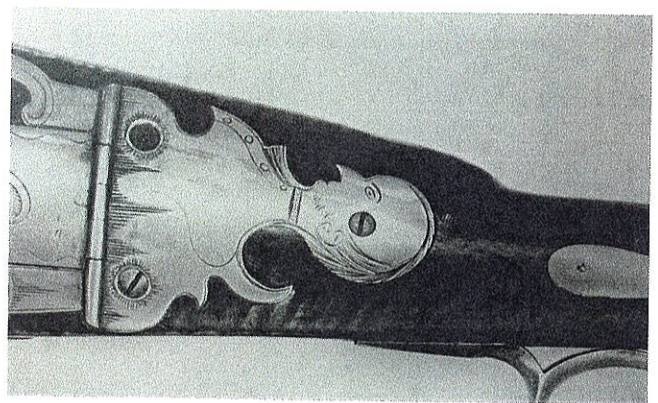
*Close-up of engraving on finial, Rifle 1.

*Rifle 2: Views of a percussion rifle made by Daniel Marker, Senior. Photo by James Whisker, AOLRC files*

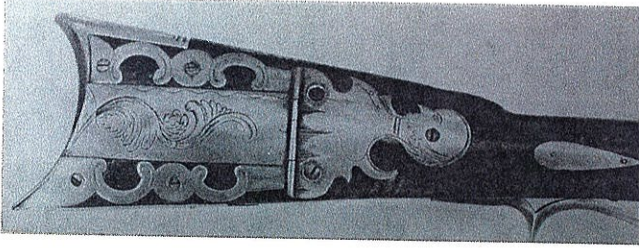


*Rifle 2: Close-up of rocco-style carving behind cheekpiece.

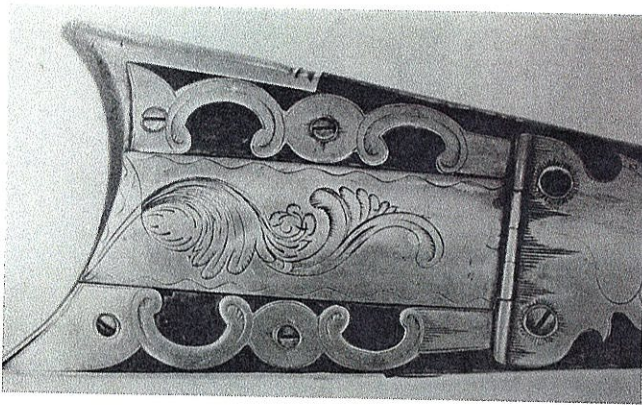




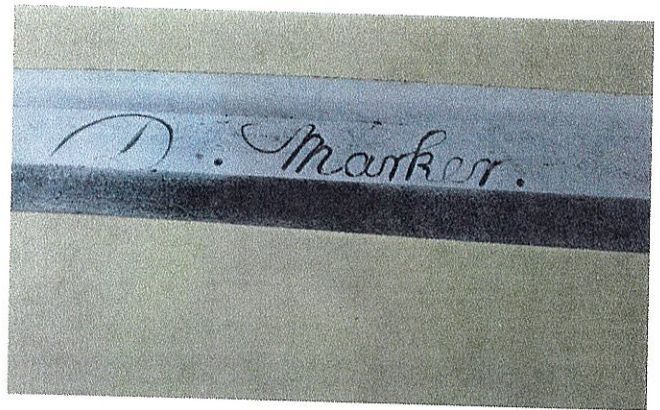

## Some Notes on Smith Lafferty, Richland County

Lafferty, Smith (1824-). gunsmith. Bellville, Jefferson Twp., Richland County. Smith Lafferty was born on 16 January 1822 in Harrison County, Ohio. 1850, Smith Lafferty, gunsmith, 26, born in OH, value \$500; Adeline, 24, born in PA; Florence, 3, born in OH. 1863, Civil War draft registration: Lafferty Smith, 42, born in OH, unmarried [?], gunsmith. 1870, Palmyra Twp., Warren County, IA: Smith Lafferty, gunsmith, 48, value \$800 real estate, \$600 personal; Ann L., 28, both

born in OH; Elton Adams, 12. 1880, Winterset, Center Twp., Madison County, IA: Smith Lafferty, gunsmith, 49 [!], born in OH; Ann, 39, born in PA, also lodgers on household. 1885, Madison County. He died on 8 March 1899 in Madison County, Iowa, aged 77 years. He was buried at Winterset City Cemetery, Winterset, Madison County [For more on Lafferty, see: Find A Grave Memorial # 13663184; Iowa State Census; Census; Ancestry].

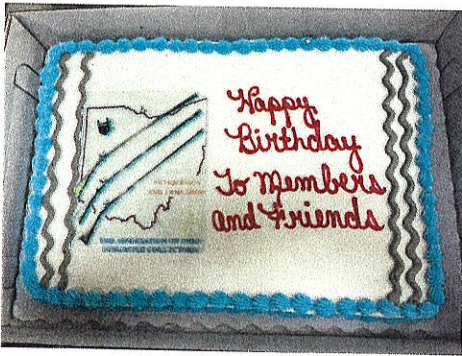


# Ladies of AOLRC News
